



Scintillating! After a 2-year hiatus, the NCVF reignited its annual collegiate club championship extravaganza in hot and sunny Phoenix, Arizona, drawing a record 488 club teams from across the country. Teams played in twelve competitive divisions scheduled over 75 courts at the Phoenix Convention Center, culminating in single-elimination bracket play for all teams.

The Men's and Women's Division 1 and 2 Gold Championship Finals were played on a championship court uniquely installed along the first base line at Chase Field, home of the Arizona Diamondbacks Major League Baseball team. With over 9,000 players, family members and friends in attendance, fans cheered on their favorite teams, sang Sweet Caroline, and celebrated a most unforgettable resurgence for collegiate club volleyball programming.

UC Santa Barbara captured its first ever NCVF Championship by defeating Virginia Tech in the Men's Division 1 Gold Final. In the Women's Division 1 Gold Final, UC Berkeley also captured a first-ever championship by topping Dayton. In Division 2, all four Gold Finals teams hailed from Wisconsin, with UW-Eau Claire women outlasting UW-La Crosse, and UW-Eau Claire men winning over UW-La Crosse. Over 850 self-funded, student-led collegiate club teams registered with the NCVF in the 2022 NCVF Season, with NCVF Recognized Leagues and school club's staging thousands of NCVF classified competitions in advance of and leading to the 2022 NCVF Championships in Phoenix event.

At its annual NCVF Championship Captains Meeting, NCVF announced Kansas City as its host city for the 2023 NCVF National Championship. Kansas City has been a participant favorite for several of NCVF's previous championship tournaments.
